KEY MATTERS CONSIDERED FY2025

Major items of discussion and consultation included:

- National Allied Health Practice Engagement Toolkit including service implementation and Allied Health education needs.
- Multidisciplinary Team Care (MDT) pilot project regular update regarding project planning, implementation and assessment sought from the Clinical Council.
- Hospital Discharge seeking advocacy from the PHN.
- Communication between Allied Health Professionals and other Primary Care professionals including GPs.
- Changes to Chronic condition MBS items
 numbers impact on Allied Health practice
- Dementia Training consultation in 2024 led to training opportunities for allied health in 2025
- Al impact on Allied Health special committee formed to discuss the development if an information evening provided for Allied Health

professionals discussing AI and the impact on practice and health delivery.

- Combined Clinical Council event this event in December 2025 brought together GPs and Allied Health Practitioners to discuss Disaster and Emergency Management. This meeting identified barriers and enablers and has informed our work in this space during 2025. This topic is an ongoing area of focus for the AHCC.
- Workforce pressures and barriers to access to Allied healthcare services in our region.

LOOKING FORWARD TO FY25

The Allied Health Clinical Council will continue to identify and discuss key issues relevant to Allied Health Professionals in the region, with the goal of uncovering program opportunities and areas for advocacy. We anticipate an ongoing focus on multidisciplinary team care, the role of Al in allied health, and providing input on the implementation of our 2024-2029 Strategic Plan.
