

Community Wellbeing and Resilience Grants Round 3 Funded Activities

Wentworth Healthcare, the provider of the Nepean Blue Mountains Primary Health Network, funded Round 3 Community Wellbeing and Resilience Grants by the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care. to support the mental health of those affected by the 2022 floods.

Our Community Wellbeing and Resilience Grants enable communities to choose their own way to respond to the losses, anxiety and distress they have experienced, as well as actively participate in their recovery. Round 3 provided grants up to \$10,000.
