# 2024 Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Program

# Aged Care Facilities

## Please distribute to all doctors and staff in your facility

- 1. All residents should receive the 2024 seasonal influenza vaccine and, as appropriate, pneumococcal vaccine (Prevenar 13).
- 2. Fluad® Quad is an enhanced quadrivalent influenza vaccine (QIV), registered for use in adults aged 65 years and over.
- 3. Pre-order influenza vaccine online at <u>nsw.tollhealthcare.com</u> from **9am Monday 4th March 2024**. Deliveries will begin when the influenza vaccine becomes available. Pre orders **close at 4.30pm Friday 15th March 2024**.

#### Annual influenza vaccination is recommended for ALL residents

- Vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 65 years and over to reduce the risk of influenza complications and to prevent influenza outbreaks in aged care facilities.

- All residents in aged care facilities are eligible for free influenza vaccine.
- Vaccinating from mid-April provides protection before the peak season takes place.
- In 2024, Fluad® Quad, an enhanced QIV, will be available for use in residents aged 65 years and over. For residents under 65 years, a regular quadrivalent vaccine can be ordered.

#### **COVID-19 and other vaccines**

- Influenza vaccines can be given on the same day as COVID-19 vaccines.
- Take the opportunity to ensure residents are up to date with **pneumococcal** vaccinations as recommended in the <u>Australian Immunisation Handbook</u>.

- If co-administering influenza and COVID-19 vaccines, consider offering other vaccines on a separate visit to reduce the risk of adverse events.

#### Staff influenza vaccination

- All providers of Australian Government subsidised residential care must fund an annual vaccination program that offers a free vaccine to staff and volunteers.
- Staff are strongly recommended to receive a seasonal influenza vaccine to protect themselves and residents that they care for against influenza.
- Government funded vaccines provided for residents must NOT be used to vaccinate staff or volunteers.

#### Ordering influenza vaccine

- From 9am Monday 4th March 2024, the government funded influenza vaccines can be pre-ordered online at: <u>nsw.tollhealthcare.com</u>. Pre-orders will close at 4.30pm, Friday 15th March 2024, after this date we will return to routine ordering and delivery.
- If your facility does not already have a vaccine account, please complete the online vaccine ordering account registration form at <u>https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/vaccine-ordering.aspx</u>.
- Orders must be made online. Orders that are sent by email or fax will no longer be accepted.
- Please call the NSW Vaccine Centre on **1300 656 132** prior to submitting an online registration form to confirm if your facility has an existing vaccine account.
- Subsequent orders can be made online once you have received your initial order, however subsequent orders will only be delivered once all pre-allocated flu orders have been distributed. There may be limits placed on orders to ensure equitable vaccine distribution to all providers in NSW.
- Only the person assigned with the role of managing a Residential Facility is authorised under Section 10(4)(d) of the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966 to order influenza and pneumococcal vaccines.

#### All vaccinations must be reported to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)

- Reporting of all vaccinations to the AIR is mandatory.
- Providers must apply for access to the AIR via Provider Digital Access (PRODA). Further information

#### **Cold Chain Management**

- Vaccines must be stored between +2°C to +8°C in accordance with the National Vaccine Storage Guidelines 'Strive for 5' available at: <u>www.health.gov.au/resources/publications/national-vaccine-</u> <u>storage-guidelines-strive-for-5.</u>
- Vaccines MUST be stored in their original packaging; this helps to protect them from temperature fluctuations and UV light.
