

# 2024 Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Program

## **Community Pharmacy**

### Please distribute to all pharmacist immunisers in your pharmacy

- 1. From March 2024, free influenza vaccines will be available to eligible people under the National Immunisation Program.
- 2. Pharmacist immunisers should target all Aboriginal people and medically-at risk patients, 5 years and over, pregnant women and people aged 65 years and over.
- 3. Prepare your pharmacy for the influenza season by reviewing the Influenza Vaccination Provider Toolkit 2024 available at <a href="https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/flu-provider-toolkit.aspx">https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/flu-provider-toolkit.aspx</a>
- 4. Pre-allocations of influenza vaccines should be **confirmed online from 9am Monday 4th March 2024**. Deliveries will begin when the influenza vaccine becomes available.
  Confirmation of pre-allocations **close at 4.30pm Friday 15**<sup>th</sup> **March 2024**.

#### **2024 INFLUENZA VACCINATION**

- Annual influenza vaccination from mid-April is the single most effective way to protect your patients and others from severe influenza and prevent hospitalisations and deaths.
- Equip yourself to make strong influenza vaccine recommendations, your vaccine recommendations matter. #### **ELIGIBLITY AND PRIORITY GROUPS**

- Influenza vaccination is recommended for all people aged 6 months and over (pharmacist immunisers are authorised to administer vaccines to people aged 5 years and over).
- People at higher risk of serious influenza complications are eligible for free influenza vaccination under the National Immunisation Program.
- Prioritise all Aboriginal people and medically-at risk patients aged 5 years and over, pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy and people aged 65 years and over attending your pharmacy.
- Discuss influenza vaccination with other present family members.

#### **CO-ADMINISTRATION WITH COVID-19 AND OTHER VACCINES**

- Influenza vaccines can be co-administered with COVID-19 vaccines.
- Take the opportunity to ensure your patients are up to date with their COVID-19 and pneumococcal vaccinations as recommended in the <u>Australian Immunisation Handbook</u>.

#### PREPARING YOUR PHARMACY

- Ensure your pharmacy software can report vaccinations to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). Reporting of all vaccinations is mandatory. Further information is available at https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/proda-provider-digital-access.
- Pharmacist immunisers will need to complete the Australian Immunisation Register Application to Register as a Vaccination Provider and NSW Pharmacist declaration form to register as a vaccination provider with the Australian Immunisation Register available at <a href="https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/application-air-provider.aspx">https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/application-air-provider.aspx</a>.

#### ORDERING INFLUENZA VACCINE

- Your first order will be pre-allocated to ensure equitable and timely vaccine distribution to all providers in NSW.
- From **Thursday 29th February 2024**, you will receive email instructions from the NSW Vaccine Centre with details on how to accept the pre-allocation, please check your junk folder.
- You will be able to review and confirm your pre-allocation on Monday 4th March 2024 at 9am as per the email instructions from NSW Vaccine Centre. Pre-allocation can be confirmed online at: nsw.tollhealthcare.com.
- Pre-allocation confirmation will close at 4.30pm on Friday 15th March 2024, after this date we will return to routine ordering and delivery. Only confirmed orders will be delivered.
- Due to the timing of initial vaccine supplies into the NSW vaccine centre, pre-allocations will be
  reduced on previous years. Subsequent orders can be made online once you have received your
  initial order, however subsequent orders will only be delivered once all pre-allocated flu orders have
  been distributed. Only order enough vaccines for use in a maximum 4 week period.
- There may be limits placed on subsequent orders to manage vaccine supply during the influenza season.
- Only schedule influenza vaccination clinics once vaccine supplies are received.

#### **VACCINE DELIVERIES**

- Influenza vaccine deliveries will commence when the vaccines become available, and orders will ONLY be despatched to pharmacies who have reviewed and confirmed their first order pre-allocation.
- Due to the volume of orders at the beginning of the season, it takes around four weeks for the NSW Vaccine Centre to deliver all first influenza vaccine orders.
