Domestic and family violence is complex and can occur in all relationships.

The Nepean Blue Mountains Primary Health Network (NBMPHN) Recognise, Respond and Refer (RRR) program was designed as a whole of practice/centre approach to improve the primary healthcare response for those who may be affected by domestic and family violence (DFV).

The following services are provided:

- Access to a team of skilled and dedicated DFV Linkers who can provide a broad range of DFV support in your practice/centre.
- Free DFV training delivered to your practice* and online. Also includes access to Your Practice Portal** webinars.

*Minimum of 4 participants for in-practice sessions.

**Your Practice Portal is an online education and training platform.

Domestic and Family Violence Linkers

DFV linkers have been engaged as part of our RRR program to provide support to practices/ centres, and to minimise the waiting times for referral to appropriate services.

DFV Linkers provide a range of support to your practice/centre which can include:

- De-identified case consultations
- Resources and information
- Details on a range of relevant support services (financial counselling, advocacy, crisis services, access to court/legal assistance)
- Information on Behaviour Change programs
- Risk Assessments and Safety Planning

We have funded Relationships Australia to deliver the **DFV Linker service**.

Domestic and Family Violence Training

The one hour *Introduction to Domestic and Family Violence* session covers:

- The prevalence of domestic and family violence.
- The barriers to leaving/seeking support.
- Information on how to recognise the signs of domestic violence and the health impacts.
- How to appropriately respond to disclosures and make effective referral pathways.
- Resources and information on how DFV Linkers can support your practice/centre.
